Thanks are due to Vaughan for making arrangements for this organ to be heard by us all and for all his work in preparing this program. Thanks also to Marilyn Polson and Esther Nui for all their help "behind the scenes" to ensure that this event ran smoothly.

A reception, music exchange, and annual meeting followed at the school across the street. At the meeting reports were heard from the Secretary, Treasurer (included in this newsletter), and Program Committee. Updates were heard concerning the National Convention, Lending Library, Website, and Operating Procedures.

FALL VERMONT AGO EVENTS IN PREPARATION

On Sunday, September 24 at 4:00 p.m. the Chapter will celebrate the 125th anniversary of the Johnson & Son organ in the First Baptist Church in Bellows Falls. Built in 1892 it is in essentially original condition and will be played by Lynnette Combs and Linda Robinson, the church's organist. Directions will be in the September newsletter. Save the date!

On Sunday, October 22 the Chapter will tour three churches in Manchester and Manchester Center. At 3:00 p.m. we will hear the 1959 three-manual Moller organ at the First Congregational Church in Manchester. We will then proceed up Route 7 to Manchester Center to visit Zion Episcopal Church and its 1930 two-manual Moller organ followed by First Baptist Church and its 1926 two-manual organ by Johnson & Son known for its brightly stenciled facade pipes.
